Medical Tracker

After half term we will be trailing a new, electronic medical system that will be used to record all medical conditions, medication brought into school and all administration of any medication. This will mean however that we can only administer medication that has been **prescribed by a doctor**, therefore calpol and/or nurofen **will not** be able to administered by any of our staff. However, you are able to come into school and administer this yourself.

As part of this new process you will receive a notification when your child has received their medication and it will be logged onto our internal system.

Over the next few weeks we are hoping to use this new system to log all of our injuries that happen in school time, therefore changing from a paper copy to an electronic notification of any injury within school time through your email address, with the understanding that if we felt the injury was serious and they needed collecting we would call you to let you know.

Well done boys on your super achievements!






Maths Newsletter

Menorah from Rainbow's End has been learning her number bonds to 10 and impressing her teacher with her speed and accuracy. Well done Menorah!




Year 2

Year 4




In **Swithland**, **Jason** has been excelling at solving a range of different questions by selecting an efficient mental strategy. His classmates describe him as a "human calculator"!

Top Tips to Support Maths at Home

Please continue to ensure that children are completing their maths homework each week that is set by their teacher and that you are supporting your children in learning key fluency skills, such as learning their times tables and telling the time on an analogue and digital clock. Here are some top tips for you to try at home.

Children in Foundation

To support your child at home, try to practise counting out objects, such as buttons, toys or sticks collected on a walk. Encourage your child to point to each object as they say the number name.

Songs and rhymes are also a great for helping young children learn to count. Focus on numbers 1-5 and then 1-10. Try 'Five Little Ducks Went Swimming One Day' and '1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Once I Caught a Fish Alive'.

Do maths every day! Helping your child get dressed, count buttons or spots on clothing, going to the shops, singing counting songs, counting the steps on the stairs and using clocks around the house.

Children in Key Stage One

In Key Stage One, the key focus of maths is to develop a solid foundation of maths knowledge to continue building on as they move up through the school. To deepen your child's understanding you could try using a variety of vocabulary when phrasing maths questions. For example, "more", "plus", "altogether", "total", "add" could all be used to refer to an addition problem.

Having a quick recall for simple number facts is also a vital skill. You can spend just 5-minutes a day practicing these skills to make a huge difference in your child's learning. Skills such as number bonds to 10 and 20, single digit addition/subtraction and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s will support your child in making meaningful progress in maths.

Children in Key Stage Two...

Make the most of daily activities like driving, by playing games such as adding the number plate numbers of other cars or adding the number of motorbikes and bicycles you can see. Adding a timed element to calculations such as timetables can be great for working on speed and fluency.

When you want to focus on mental maths strategies, playing games such as Bingo can help maths become much more engaging. Work out a list of calculations and write the answers in a bingo board format; they'll need to circle the right answer when the calculation is read out. They'll probably be accustomed to doing such activities as part of whole-class work at school. Another website that is useful is hit the button, it is free and the kids love the timed element.

Why don't you have a go and they can try and beat you!

Learning multiplication tables is a crucial skill for life, and supports children's calculation skills in many areas of maths. Children begin to learn the basics of multiplication and division early on at school, and their skills and knowledge build as they progress. By the end of year 6, they are expected to know off-by-heart all times tables and related division facts up to 12 x 12. The best way to learn tables is through practise and repetition, but there are simple




