On Thursday 9 November, Year 6 visited the Warning Zone life skills centre in Leicester. It is a Leicester based charity, dedicated to teaching life-skills and safeguarding children. The children had a safety tour which was made up of realistic set piece scenarios. They looked at potential dangers in and on building sites, risks around water, road safety as well as many more! They also learnt about E-Safety which taught the children about staying safe when using the internet. The children listened attentively and answered questions excellently! Well done Year 6!

The PTA have asked if any parents have any time to spare to help setting up as they would love your support, please come to the office to put your name down.








Christmas Diary Dates


The Owl Who Came for Christmas
