



Leicester City Vs. Napoli




"Recently, I went to King Power Stadium with my dad where I saw Napoli draw 2-2 with Leicester. On this humid evening, the 16th of September, the Leicester City attacker Ayoze Perez scored in the 9th minute, Harvey Barnes in the 64th and Victor Osimhen for Napoli in the 69th and 87th. As the sky grew blacker and the air colder Wilfred Ndidi was sent off in the 90+3 minute. Victor Osimhen completed the comeback for Napoli (a southern city of Italy). The referee was shouted at for being quite biased by not giving lots of fouls to Leicester. The attendance was 29579 in this UEFA Europa League (Group C) game, a competition consisting of European countries."

It was the 85th minute and Leicester were holding on to their lead well but then Napoli scored an equalised to make it 2-2 and Leicester Fans went quiet but the Napoli fans were jumping for joy."
