Covid etiquette for all visitors to the school

Just a quick reminder for all parents dropping off and picking up their children from school, please continue to follow government guidelines. Hopefully all of us are looking forward to being vaccinated soon (if you haven't been already) and we can get back to a normal life!

Monitoring of Educational Standards through School Visits

Despite the lockdown Governors have been conducting visits either virtually or in person where it was essential (following social distancing guidelines). Some of the highlights of our recent visits were:

Health and Safety: Mr Malvinder Plaha conducted an in person visit in February as a follow-up to a virtual visit done late last year. We found that corrective actions described in the virtual visit had been carried out as described. We also found some minor issues with paths and walls that the school will address. The school has made good progress in getting ready for the return of the children including the re-painting of the canteen and new markings in the playground. We discussed at length the condition of the old temporary classrooms; the Head Teacher has submitted a new bid for funding to replace these buildings, but will also develop a contingency strategy should this funding not be approved. Despite the condition of these buildings, the school has been doing all they can to make the classrooms a suitable learning environment for the children.

Maths: A follow-up virtual visit was conducted by Mr Malvinder Plaha and Mrs Pat Thompson from the Scholars Academy Trust late last year. At the time we found that Maths leads were making good progress in running a recovery curriculum and implementing initiatives to raise the profile of Maths in other subjects.

English: Mr Barry Thomas conducted a virtual English visit late last year with Mrs Sarah Richards from the Scholars Academy Trust. We found that in general the children have found it easy to catch up from the missed time in school during the first lockdown. Learning from March 2020 is already embedded and there does not need to be much repeating or re-learning.

Science: Mrs Mumtaz Kynaston-Pearson & Mrs Nafeesa Katib conducted a virtual science visit in March this year. We found that all year groups are attaining expected standards. We also discussed the links Launde has built with Beauchamp to offer STEM sessions to our students. In addition, we learned that the school is currently gathering evidence to renew the Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM) at Outreach level, the highest level there is to recognise the work the school does both within the Trust and supporting other schools further afield.

Website compliance: Mr Visveswaran Mallayan conducted a thorough review of the website and found it to be compliant with Ofsted requirements.
