YEAR 2 – AUTUMN TERM 2022

ENGLISH

We will be using a range of media to develop children's speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. This will include:

The Secret Life of Pets – developing inference skills, writing descriptive sentences and writing a creative story.

Where the Poppies Now Grow – information text about significant individuals, setting descriptions and poems linked to Remembrance Day.

Traditional Tales – characteristics of good and bad characters, character and setting descriptions and creating their own alternative tale based on stories they are familiar with.

We will expect the correct use of punctuation and encourage the children to use a range of sentence styles. The children will be taught to use varied and exciting vocabulary, including the use of expanded noun phrases.

Phonics

In the autumn term children will have the chance to consolidate the alternative Phase 5 graphemes, including split digraphs, and to use these confidently to read and write sentences and paragraphs.

Get, Set, Go!

As a Year 2 team, our first priority is to make sure that every child feels happy, safe and secure coming into their new class. To enable us to do this, we have planned an exciting topic that will provide plenty of opportunities for the children to talk about their feelings, interests and experiences and recap their learning from Year 1. This exciting topic will also give children the opportunity to form new friendships in their class. The book "Juniper Jupiter" by Lizzy Stewart about a super powered child is used as a basis for this topic to engage children's imaginations, enthusiasm and interest.

READING

lass and individual reading, pupils will be expected to read fluently using expression. By discussing characters, settings, events and nonfiction information the children will develop greater comprehension skills including prediction, retrieving information and inference.

Children will receive **two books a week** to take home and read. Please listen to your child read every day. It is also beneficial to ask questions about the book to develop their comprehension skills. If you finish the books ahead of time, there is still value in re-reading the book again to help your child embed new vocabulary. The books will then be changed the following week on a given reading day.

PE

During PE, the classes will begin to learn about moving and travelling in different ways through gymnastics and dance lessons. They will additionally learn important team work and communication skills through a variety of ball skills and outdoor games.

Children are required to come to school in their P.E kit on **Tuesday** and **Wednesday**.

For health and safety, no jewellery should be worn on these days.

Homework

Homework is an opportunity to consolidate what they have learnt at school. It will be given out each Friday electronically on Microsoft Teams and will need to be completed by the following Wednesday.

MATHS

Every day the children will practise and develop oral and mental skills e.g. counting, mental strategies, rapid recall number bonds and times table facts. In groups and independent work, we will be covering the following skills and using them to deepen the children's mathematical understanding:

- Counting, properties of numbers, number sequences and times tables.
- Place value and ordering numbers.
- Using the four operations (+ x ÷) to solve problems.
- Fractions halves of shapes and numbers.
- Measures length and time.

Throughout the Autumn term, Year 2 will look at the Muslim faith. We will also share a special year group assembly all about Diwali and perform the annual Christmas production at the end of the

term.

The will learn about the Spanish greetings, family members and counting to 20.

COMPUTING

In the computer suite, we will be practicing word processing skills and use search engines to research significant individuals.

Animals, including humans

This term, the children will enjoy learning more about lifecycles including those of animals and humans. They will:

• Look at the differences and similarities of each stage in the human life cycle

SCIENCE

- Compare how life cycles differ between species.
- Animals and their young.
- Explore the five main food groups and how each one contributes to a healthy body.
- Investigate the importance of exercise and the effects upon the body will also form part of their investigation.

HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

Pupils will learn about significant events, people and places. This will include:

- Remembrance Day and its relevance to Oadby.
- The local area of Oadby and how it has changed over time.
- Identify human and physical features that make up our town.
- Devise simple maps and construct symbols in a key.



ART

In this skilled based subject, children will explore the work of different artists and a skill they have used. They will produce artwork based on topics they have learnt about in class. This will include:

- Portrait painting using colour mixing.
- Diwali artwork exploring warm and cool colours with symmet
- Remembrance Day artwork inspired by Monet.
- Cartoon-style illustrations of pets.



MUSIC

Music this term will help children to learn about rhythm, pitch and pulse when singing, playing, improvising and composing music. Children will also listen to and appraise South African music based on a song called "Hands, Feet, Heart".
