Strikes 1 February

As you will be aware from my note in last week's newsletter and the national news, it has been declared that the National Education Union is taking industrial action in the form of a strike next Wednesday 1 February. As you can appreciate, this is a very personal decision as to whether to strike or not and should be respected fully as it not ever a decision taken lightly by any staff. This does only effect members of this union currently. After careful consideration from our staff, a majority will not be striking next Wednesday and so the school will remain open however some classes will be affected as those teachers have elected to take lawful industrial action. I appreciate that the industrial action is disruptive for parents but we will continue to ensure our children are supported through this time.
