Covid Reporting

As of Friday 1 April, the rules around Covid testing have changed. It is no longer mandatory to test and Covid tests are no longer available for free.

The new advice regarding isolation is as follows:

- Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- Children with symptoms do not need to isolate for a set number of days, only for as long
 as their symptoms last. However, if you do choose to test your child and receive a
 positive result, you are advised to keep them at home for at least 3 days.
