New arrangements for Year 1 drop off and pick up

From Monday 14 March the children in Year 1 will no longer need to line up on the infant playground for either drop off or pick up times. In the mornings the children will need to go to their classroom door where their teacher will be waiting outside for them from 8.40am.

The children can then be collected from their classroom at 3.15pm.

In line with this change, the car park gates leading to the infant playground will no longer be open during drop off and pick up times from Monday 14 March so please revert to using the main gate at the bottom of New Street.

Covid reporting

The government guidance has recently changed meaning that people who test positive for Covid are now longer **legally** required to isolate. However, the government still **advise** that adults and children who test positive stay at home and to avoid contact with other people, and so we will continue to follow this advice.

If your child tests positive they should not attend school. After 5 days, they may take a Lateral Flow Test followed by another the next day - if both are negative, and they do not have a temperature, they can safely return to their normal routine.


Casual Cleaners

Books of the Week - The Blue Peter Book Awards 2022


Since 2000, the enormously popular and influential Blue Peter Book Awards have been recognising and celebrating the best authors, the most creative illustrators and the greatest reads for children.

This year the winning books are **The Last Bear** by Hannah Gold (illustrated by Levi Pinfold), and **Invented by Animals** by Christiane Dorian (illustrated by Gosia Herba).



The Last Bear won the award for best fiction book. It is a moving tale that mixes the adventure of life in the Arctic Circle with danger, excitement, a touching exploration of April's relationship with her father, and a thought-provoking exploration of the climate emergency.

Invented by Animals won the award for best book with facts. It is a fun and informative non-fiction book that explores how animal anatomy, behaviour and skills have influenced the development of a range of human inventions.
