Covid reporting

The government guidance has recently changed meaning that people who test positive for Covid are now no longer **legally** required to isolate. However, the government still **advise** that adults and children who test positive stay at home and to avoid contact with other people, and so we will continue to follow this advice.

If your child tests positive they should not attend school. After 5 days, they may take a Lateral Flow Test followed by another the next day - if both are negative, and they do not have a temperature, they can safely return to their normal routine.
