COP 26

This week the children in KS2 have been learning about the UN Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26) in assembly and it was a main discussion point at the School Council meeting. Year 2 took part in a lesson all about this important topic too.

The children agreed to focus on three differences that we could make at school to help reduce the resources that we use so that we are only using what we need.

The three actions we have pledged to undertake are:

1) turning lights off when we leave the room, and turning taps off when we have finished using the water

2) making sure our litter is put in bins and not left on the floor as this may harm wildlife living in our school grounds

3) looking after school and home items we use to make them last longer - including labelling school jumpers so they are not left in lost property and then parents have to buy more clothes, taking care of items in our pencil cases.
