We welcome you back on Monday 27 February.



## Years 5 and 6 Author Visit






### Key Stage Two

## Year 4



This term, children in Year 4 have been continuing to learn about The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. This piece of work was completed by **Minson** in **Foxton**. He told us: We used a lot of detail to make this newspaper report interesting. I had a lot of fun thinking about how to make Mr Tumnus' arrest interesting.

## Year 5

In Year 5, the children have been reading and working with the book, 'The Hobbit.' **Kavita** from **Strath Avon** told us: "I really liked writing this Wanted poster because I enjoyed describing how dangerous, Smaug, the dragon, was.



## Year 6



As part of their 'Goosebumps' topic, **Mustafa** in **Oakwood** wrote a story extract from his own horror story. He told us: "I liked writing this because I was able to be as creative as I wanted to be. I also enjoy writing horror stories."

## Questions about your book

### Before you start

- Why did you choose this book?
- What do you think will happen in the story?
- If this is a non-fiction book, what interesting facts do you hope to find out?

### Halfway through

- What has happened so far?
- Who are the main characters?
- How do you think the main characters are feeling?
- How would you describe the story so far?
- How does the story make you feel?
- What might happen next? How do you know?
- Questions about non-fiction books:
  - What have you learned so far?
  - What are you hoping to find out next?
  - What is the most interesting thing you have learnt?

### At the end

- Did you enjoy the book?
- What was the best part of the story? Why?
- Would you recommend this book to a friend?
- Why would you recommend it, or why wouldn't you?
- Would you choose more books by the same author?

## Top Tips

If you are struggling to understand what you are reading, try some of these ideas:

- Read the difficult parts again.
- Slow your reading down a bit.
- Ask someone to read with you and talk about anything you don't understand.
- Look at any pictures.
- Look up any difficult words in a dictionary.

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When you have finished a book, you can check your understanding by trying some of these activities:

- Tell the story in your own words.
- Draw pictures of scenes or characters from the book.
- Write a letter to a character.
- Describe some of the main characters. Try to include their feelings and thoughts.
- Try to write a different ending to the story.
- Make a list of things you have learnt from the book.

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Can you think of any questions you want to ask your teacher or someone at home? For example:

- Was there anything you didn't understand?
- Is there something you would like to know more about?
- Did you find any words that you didn't understand?
- Tell your teacher/parent any new words that you have learnt.

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


